Economic Development

- Implementing a global investment attraction strategy through an Auckland Investment Office
 - Digital Auckland "kick start" through ultra-fast Broadband fibre rollout across Auckland and a plan for public place WiFi throughout Auckland
 - Increasing and deepening links with Auckland's major trading partners in the Asia-Pacific region
 - Implementing a youth employment action plan
 - Maori Economic Development Strategic Framework implemented
 - Wynyard Quarter Innovation Precinct
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Transport

- Roll out new electric trains across the Auckland network
 - Complete implementation of the integrated ticketing system
 - Roll out school travel plans to all schools in the region
 - Complete implementation of the new public transport network
 - Push for construction of City Rail Link to commence in 2016
 - Seek agreement of government to alternative transport funding mechanisms
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Housing

- Delivery of the Auckland Housing Accord which requires 39,000 dwellings or vacant sites consented within three years.
 - Integrated forward land and infrastructure programme to ensure all infrastructure is available when needed for housing and other developments.
 - Deliver Auckland Housing Action Plan including greater supply, more flexibility of choice of different housing types and sizes and more affordable housing
 - Work with Housing New Zealand and community sector providers to deliver more social housing to meet needs
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Environment

- Complete Energy and Climate Change Mitigation Strategy
 - Begin implementation of actions to cut carbon emissions across Auckland by 40 per cent compared with 1990 levels, by 2040
 - Implement in Auckland the National Policy Statement on Freshwater Management
 - Implementation of the Waste Management and Minimisation Plan
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Culture

- Implement Arts and Culture Strategic Action Plan
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The Southern Initiative

- Working with Government on support for Te Papa North project including associated urban design and micro-enterprises
 - Collaboration with Government, business and community on projects including Maori and Pacific trades training, early childhood education, training and skills development, economic development and jobs and housing and improved public transport.
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Governance and Management

- Establishment of Maunga Authority (co-governance body) for the volcanic cones included in Tamaki Collective Treaty Settlements
 - Further development of local board model and funding policy
 - Integrated information systems (Newcore) to bring together the council legacy systems into one operating environment.
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Planning and Implementation

- Unitary Plan operative by September 2016
 - Auckland Long-term Plan 2015-2025 adopted
 - Bylaw Review Programme completed
 - Hauraki Gulf Marine Spatial Plan completed
 - 10 Local Area Plans completed
 - Local Alcohol Policy implemented
 - 21 Local Board Plans for second term completed
 - Implementation of Auckland Design Manual and strong promotion of quality design of built environment
 - Implementation of place-making approach to provisions of social and civil infrastructure and amenities in centres
 - Implementation of integrated one-stop-shop approach to consents and approvals
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
